Medical Ministry

February is Heart Month, so let's review some quick tips to keep your main muscle in shape!

Walk it out: Did you know that walking just 20 minutes a day can help ward off a heart attack or stroke? It can be as simple as taking the stairs instead of the elevator, or parking farther out in the parking lot so you have to walk farther to get into the store. If you already workout, step up your game a bit. Not only is cardio activity (like running, walking, swimming) important, but activities like stretching and strength training are important for a healthy lifestyle too.

Go ahead, enjoy that cuppa joe: Compared to people that didn't drink coffee, those that did drink a cup a day saw a 7% decreased risk of stroke and 8% decrease risk of heart failure. Just be careful not to add those high calorie and fat additions that would cancel the health benefit.

Hit the snooze button: Getting 7-8 hours of sleep a night can reduce your risk of weight gain, which in turn can reduce the risk of heart attack. The time when your body is sleeping is also a time for blood pressure and heart rate to decrease, giving your heart a little rest and time for cellular damage to repair.

Go ahead, give a hug: Research shows that hugs can deliver some real health benefits including lowering blood pressure and heart rate as well as easing stress. Hugs convey a sense of connection and are linked to positive emotions. They are also known to increase the release of the "bonding" hormone, oxytocin, and decrease the release of stress hormones such as cortisone.

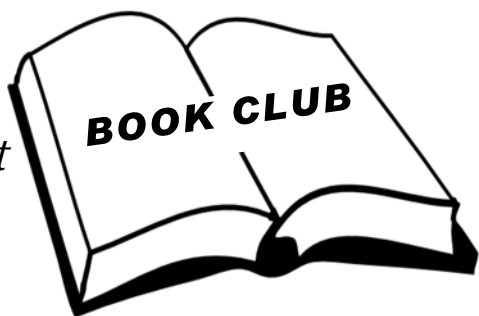

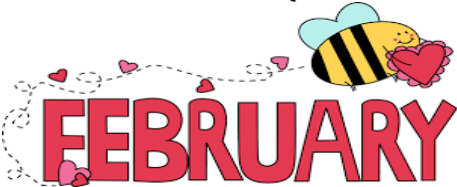
