Medical Ministry

May is Skin Cancer Awareness Month.

Skin cancer is the most common of all cancers. Each year nearly 1 million people will be diagnosed with it. There are 3 main types of skin cancer: Basal cell, Squamous cell, and Melanoma. There are other unusual types of skin cancer that include Merkel cell, Kaposi sarcoma, Cutaneous lymphoma, skin adnexal tumors and various types of sarcomas.

Treatment for basal cell and squamous cell carcinomas (cancers) is fairly straightforward and generally surgical removal is adequate. Malignant melanoma, depending on the size of the tumor, may require multiple treatment methods including surgery, radiation, chemotherapy and immunotherapy. By far the best approach to skin cancer is prevention and early detection.

Prevention tips include: limit sun exposure especially between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., apply sunscreen every day using at least 30 spf before sun exposure and every 60-80 minutes during exposure, avoid tanning booths, and conduct monthly self checks. When doing monthly self checks, be sure to check your entire body, even hard to reach areas. Enlist the help of a friend or family and use a full length mirror and a hand held mirror to see your back. Don't forget to look at your hands, feet, and scalp as well. Although the number of skin cancer cases is rising, illness and death rates have declined because more of them are being caught earlier when they are easy to treat.



The Building Committee met on April 16, 2018.

Design

Construction Documents have been approved. The Design Team is continuing to explore re-purposing ideas for our current space. Work continues on the complexities of gaining approval from FEMA on the floodplain compliance issue. Farnsworth Group has assigned an expert on such matters, Emily Jenkins, PE, PHD to complete the final steps in the process. When approval is secured, the Village of Morton will be able to issue the necessary permits for work to begin. No specific date has been assured. As we all know the wheels of government grind exceedingly slow. We hoped to avoid a lengthy process and had laid the groundwork for addressing it. We anticipated the possibility of a delay – just not one this long.

As Paul says in Philippians, "forgetting what is past and straining toward what lies ahead, we press on towards the goal . . ."

Finance

Good news on the finance front. We are very close to meeting all the requirements for cash on hand, pledges and borrowing power. Our goal was to have a total of \$3,400,000 in cash, assets (bills paid), and pledges yet to be received during 2018, 2019, and 2020. As of the end of March, we have \$2,349,466 in cash and assets, and we are very close to having \$1,100,000 in pledges yet to be received.

Timeline

We have met our goal of having Construction Documents completed. Our next step is to work with the contractor to define sub-contractors through a bidding process. As our contract states, the Building Committee has final approval of all sub-contractors.

Suggestions/Feedback for the Building Committee

"In Design phase please make sure restrooms have tankless water heaters - same as present restrooms and nursery on west side of building." Also: "Design doors to Gathering Room so caskets can be moved easily - maybe sliding doors."


